On the table below you will be able to keep track of your child's class attendance.


You can also see how many times the class has been interrupted through children arriving late to school. Punctuality is extremely important for your child to be fully equipped with the whole days learning ahead of them.

## What is acceptable attendance?

Stradbroke School, The Local Authority and The Government all believe that each and every child should attend school and arrive on time for at least 96% of the time. The chart below shows that if you go on holiday for two weeks during term time your child's attendance will be below the expected attendance rate.



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## Useful Medical Information:

### Childhood Illnesses:

#### Asthma

Lots of children come down with colds when they come back to school – this maybe one of biggest triggers for people with asthma.

If your child has a dust mite allergy being inside more as the weather changes could make their asthma flare up.

Seasonal allergies, such as mould in autumn and pollen in spring and summer could also set off asthma symptoms.

Preventer inhaler routines get easily disrupted over the holidays, so children's airways can be more sensitive to triggers when they go back to school.
